Dear Cornerstone Community Church family,

I am writing this article on a cold, frigid day where the wind-chill factor is -17 degrees below zero. We have just come off an eight-day prayer emphasis from January 7-14, 2024. We met eight nights in a row at 8:00 p.m. to pray for the ministries of our Church and for God to give His protection, empowerment, joy, and favor over our beloved congregation. This is imperative for the Holy Spirit to ignite His Church in the next year. Prayer is spiritual work. We need Jesus to go ahead of our lives and trust He is working in all circumstances we face.

I am excited to give thanks for what God has done through His faithfulness in our Church' ministry throughout 2023. Now, where do we go at Cornerstone Community Church in 2024? What is Jesus saying to us as His people? How do we follow Him in our lives and as His Church?

In leadership, and in ministry, I have seen these "Five Rs of Ministry" at work in fruitful congregations. These "Five Rs of Ministry" is something I have taught the staff in my brief time at Cornerstone Community Church. The Lord Jesus gave these ideas to me to make sense of what a process of successful, fruitful ministry must have to be healthy. I did not read these out of a book. The Lord gave me these biblical concepts several years ago.

"The Five Rs of Ministry" (Pastor Jerry Ernst)

1) REACH – We must reach new people for Jesus Christ so we can develop people to follow Jesus Christ.

The idea of reaching people for Jesus Christ must be more than a slogan, but a focused passion and urgency in our soul and the DNA of Cornerstone Community Church

KEY WORD: Evangelism.

END GOAL: "Win the Lost – whatever the cost."

KEY SCRIPTURE: Matthew 9:35-38; Luke 5:1-11

2) RETRAIN – To take new believers in Christ and retrain them - from the world's system & values (worldview) - to live and think like biblical disciples.

The idea is to reform the old way of thinking and living in the ways of the world, to transformation into a Christ follower by God's Truth.

KEY WORD: Discipleship.

END GOAL: To lead new Christians to follow God's Word & biblical values. To shape and form them under Jesus' Lordship, the Bible, and the Holy Spirit.

KEY SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:9-11, 105; 2nd Corinthians 5:17; Romans 12:1-2; James 1:22-25.

3) RETAIN – To work with excellence to produce quality, growing opportunities, in God’s Church by creating biblical, relevant teaching, programs, & service.

The idea is to be intentional at “going the extra-mile” in our preparation and ministries so people do not want to miss what God is doing.

KEY WORDS: Connected, Engaged, Quality, Intentional - in what we at CCC produce, prepare, and teach.

END GOAL: To Retain people so they continue forward in their discipleship & growth and so they do not drop out of God’s Church. Why? To grow them to eventually serve and lead in the Church.

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 10:24-25; Matthew 7:13-14; John 15:1-8, 16:1; 1st Corinthians 15:58; 2nd Corinthians 3:17-18.

4) RELEASE – To equip, release and empower Christian disciples to “go” into the world to serve and reach others who do not know Jesus as Savior.

The idea is to prepare Christians to not keep their faith quiet and inactive, but alive and impactful.

KEY WORD: Equip, Develop and Send disciples out into ministry.

END GOAL: Empowering and equipping Christians in God’s Church to “go.”

KEY SCRIPTURE: Matthew 28:16-20; Mark 10:45; James 2:14-18.

5) REPRODUCE – The end goal of Christianity is to lead people to Jesus Christ and make Christian disciples who go and produce more disciples.

The idea is to get Christians to go back to step one – REACH (cyclical, ongoing).

KEY WORD: Multiply God’s Kingdom, Outreach, Evangelism.

END GOAL: To see Kingdom growth, multiplication of new Christians and bring salvation to our world, to make Jesus’ Name famous.

KEY SCRIPTURE: 2nd Timothy 2:2; Matthew 28:19-20; John 3:3, 15-17.

I know this article is full of teaching and concepts to grow a healthy Church. My prayer is Cornerstone Community Church will be built on the Word of God, prayer, discipleship, fellowship, unity in Christ, and to have Jesus’ power as we minister in our community and world. May Jesus Christ give us insight how to take people and mold people into God’s people. Amen!

A WORD OF ENCOURAGEMENT

A GREAT HARVEST...WORKERS NEEDED!

Many years ago the Lord gave me an understanding of Matthew 9:35 – 10:4. I had read this passage many times and even consulted commentaries about it, but I had never discovered its interpretation until that one special moment! As sometimes happens when we read our Bibles, God spoke directly to my heart as I read this portion of the First Gospel.

At the end of chapter 9, St. Matthew records that Jesus “went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness” (Matthew 9:35, New Revised Standard Version). 9:36 goes on to observe that Jesus had compassion for the crowds, “because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.” Immediately I felt spiritual conviction, since I often try to avoid the crowds! Far from reacting with divine compassion, I react with disdain or even fear!

In the final two verses of the chapter, my red-letter New Testament quotes what Jesus said to His disciples: “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.” Chapter 10 opens with this report: “Then Jesus summoned His twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits...and to cure every disease and every sickness” (10:1). When I recall that there are no chapter-and-verse divisions in the original manuscripts of Scripture, the lesson I learned was even more clear: The twelve disciples are called to pray for workers in God's harvest, and then they themselves became the answer to their prayers!

The importance of this passages seems obvious to me now: There is a great spiritual harvest waiting to be gathered in the field of this world...I am to pray that the Lord will call people to work in His harvest...and now I am to be one of the workers...I am to be the answer to my own prayer!

That each individual who prays that the Lord will send out Christian workers is—himself and herself—expected to become the worker he or she prayed for, is underscored by the fact that Matthew immediately identifies, by name, each disciple who was instructed to pray. Thus 10:2-4 lists, by name, each of the apostles who was to pray and who was then sent out as Christian ministers to the crowded world.

And so, dear Lord, help me see the crowds with the Savior's compassion. And, Lord, may I realize that the crowds of people in my world are potential believers, persons who need healing and salvation. So I pray, Heavenly Father, that you will send worker's into your harvest field. And yes, Lord, I am willing to be one of the workers, if you call me and equip me! O God, grant that I may become an answer to my prayer!

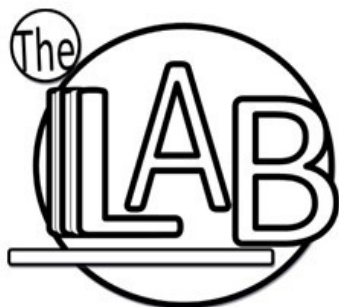

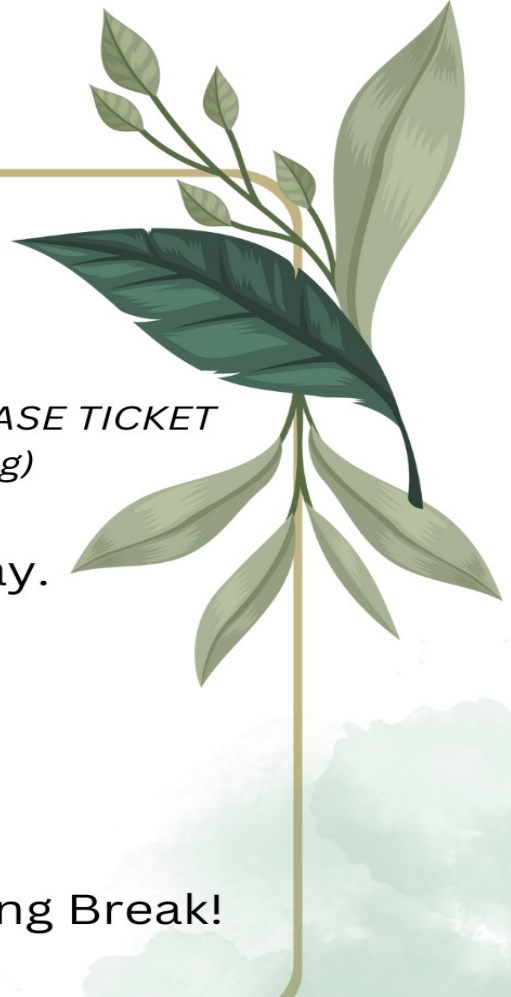
