Dear Cornerstone Community Church family,

It is hard to believe the Easter season has already passed and we are into the month of April. In Ohio, there is an event that will last only a few moments but will attract thousands to our state. I am referring to the *total solar eclipse* on April 8, 2024. Stores are selling glasses, T-shirts, coffee cups and anything they can think of - to make a profit and make the day worth remembering. A total solar eclipse only happens in the same location every 375 years.

<u>Eclipse</u>: "The total or partial obscuring of one celestial body by another; the passing into the shadow of a celestial body (transit); the state of being eclipsed; obscure, darken, to reduce in importance, surpass."

Two weeks prior, on March 25, 2024, the full moon signals its arrival. Solar eclipses can only occur when the Sun, Moon, and Earth all align. The least exciting of all eclipses, a penumbral lunar eclipse, foreshadows the spectacular show that April 8th's total solar eclipse will bring.

When I think about the Christian life to begin, it is not when the Sun, Moon and Earth all align, but rather when we are aligned with God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. When we come to the place where we understand God the Father created this world and He loves the people He created, and all that is in it. God loved the world so much, He purchased it back by sending His Son, Jesus, to die on the cross for humanity's sin.

The message of the Church is John 3:16: "(16) For God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten (unique) son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish (eternally), but have everlasting life."

As I was thinking about supernatural happenings in the Bible, in Joshua 10:12-14, Joshua spoke to the Lord when fighting the Amorites, "...and he said in the sight of Israel: 'Sun, stand still over Gibeon; and Moon, in the Valley of Aijalon. So the sun stood still, and the moon stopped, till the people had revenge upon their enemies. Is this not written in the book of Jasher? So the sun stood still in the midst of heaven, and did not hastened to go down for about a whole day. And there had been no day like that, before it or after it, that the Lord heeded the voice of a man; for the Lord fought for Israel."

Another instance of a supernatural happening was the day Jesus Christ died on the cross. The Bible says in Luke 23:44-46, "(44) It was now about the sixth hour, and darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour, (45) for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. (46) Jesus called out with a loud voice, 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.' When he had said this, he breathed his last."

According to the Blackaby Study Bible, from "the sixth hour until the ninth hour" was our modern time of 12:00 p.m. (noon) until 3:00 p.m. This was not a solar eclipse, but God the

Father sending the spiritual message to the earth that they had just killed His only Son, the Son of God, Jesus Christ.

Jews knew their Old Testament where "The Day of the Lord" would be "a day of darkness." Amos 8:9 says, "(9) On that day, says the Lord God, I will make the <u>Sun</u> to go down at noon, and <u>darken the Earth in broad daylight</u>. I will turn your feasting into mourning, and all your songs into lamentations."

This darkness speaks of a time of God's judgment upon sin. At the crucifixion - God the Father placed all the sins of humanity upon His only Son, Jesus Christ, and God poured out His wrath upon Him (Jesus).

Pastor Derek Walker – Oxford Church in England - says the following:

"Jesus stood in our place and bore the punishment we deserved. He cried out in a loud voice, 'My God, my God, Why have you forsaken me?' Jesus was separated from his Father for three hours. God signified this by blotting out the sun until Jesus had paid the price for sin in full. The sun in Scripture is often used a symbol of the Son, the Light of the world, the glory of God (Malachi 4, Hosea 6, Psalm 19). So the sun being covered in darkness represented what was happening to the Son as He was covered by the darkness of our sin and judgment." (p. 1, The Day the Sun Stopped Shining).

It is interesting in Matthew 24:27 & 29 at "(27) ... the Coming of the Son of Man. (29) Immediately after the distress of those days

'the **sun** will be darkened, and the **moon** will not give its light; the **stars** will fall from the sky, and the **heavenly bodies will be shaken**.'"

When Jesus died on "Good Friday" an earthquake occurred, and the sun stopped shining. When Jesus Returns for His Church at the Second Coming – nature will call out again – showing the Lordship of a Savior who conquered the grave for our sins to make us right before our Father in heaven at Judgment.

Do not ever ignore nature, it just might be God revealing Himself to show us His Glory!

He is Risen - He is Risen indeed!






