Dear Cornerstone Community Church family,

We are in full-swing this fall as a Church family and ministries are going forward at the start of this school year. I appreciate all the people in our church who give of their time, talent, and treasure to the Lord's work! May Jesus get the praise for Who He is and what He is doing in the lives of His people.

I had a thought the other day about my wife's favorite story in the Bible, the story of Ruth. When I think about The Book of Ruth it has so much to do with difficulties, uncertainties, pain, loss, and faith in God. Ruth was the daughter-in-law of Naomi. Naomi was married to a man named, Elimelech. They had two sons, Mahlon and Kilion. These two sons married Moabite women after their parents left Israel – and resettled in the country of Moab due to a famine (Ruth 1:1).

Shortly after moving to Moab, Naomi's husband died. Her sons had already married foreign women (Orpah and Ruth). After ten years of living in Moab, Naomi's sons both died. Naomi needed to depart and go back to Bethlehem in Israel. She pleaded with her daughters-in-law to leave her and find new husbands in Moab. Ruth refused to leave Naomi and claimed Naomi as her forever friend and mother-in-law, even after the death of her husband, Naomi's son.

The Book of Ruth is a four-chapter love story. The story is about commitment, friendship, love, and faith during challenging times. It is about going beyond what is required – by doing what is right. Ultimately, the story is about Jesus Christ being in history through difficult circumstances and God working out His overall plan for a Savior, "The Kinsman-Redeemer" (Ruth 4:8-10; 13-22).



As I summarize this story of Ruth and Naomi, I will narrow this down into "seasons." The characters in this story went through life together and endured rough and beautiful seasons, alike.

They went through...

... a season of famine.

...a season of *change*.

...a season of loss.

...a season of *choice*.

...a season of *uncertainty*.

...a season of *dependance*.

...a season of total faith.

...a season of waiting.

...a season of being noticed.

...a season of God's favor.

...a season of *fulfillment*.

...a season of completion.

...a season Beyond (The line of David, which produced our Savior, Jesus Christ).

Look for the above truths in this four-chapter book. It may very well help you in the "season" of your life you are in right now. Remember this, Church, God is in every season to produce something much larger than we can see with our limited knowledge (Psalm 32:7-8; Romans 8:28-29; Ecclesiastes 3:1-8).

Have you discovered the Church Library at Cornerstone Community Church?

Come with me as we leave the main Sanctuary! We make our way through the Welcome Area and walk along the corridor past the elevator on our left and restrooms on our right. See the next room on the right side? There it is, opposite the classroom where my FA-HO-CHA group meets on Sunday mornings. Let's step into the Church Library.

Look around. It's an attractive room with shelves of books on the walls and an exit door to the outside. Be seated on a comfortable chair. OR...wait a moment: Before you sit down, get a cup of coffee at the Keuirig coffee-maker there, on the table!

Better yet...check out the variety of books and resources offered for your enrichment by our very own Church Library. You'll find volumes on what you believe as a Christian, helps to Christian living, commentaries on the Bible, devotional meditations, and "how-to" guides on Bible Study, faith sharing, putting Christ first in your home, personal relationships, and many other topics.

Now that I've shown you our Church Library, you'll want to spend time in the room and also borrow Christian resources. And let me introduce our Church Librarian: Janet Boone organizes the library for our congregation, keeps it up-to-date, and is eager to assist you in locating the resource you need. There is a display table in the hallway just outside the library door that Janet arranges from time to time, so all of us can take note of a new resource and be reminded that our Church has a Library!

Recently I presented Janet Boone with an unusual volume for the library. It is *The Cyclopedia of Methodism* edited by Rev. Matthew Simpson of Cadiz, Ohio. Simpson was elected a Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1852, and this huge volume presents the chief facts of Methodist History up to its copyright year of 1876. This book offers an alphabetical arrangement of events marking the growth of Methodism in England and America.



Recently I presented Janet Boone with an unusual volume for the library. It is *The Cyclopedia of Methodism* edited by Rev. Matthew Simpson of Cadiz, Ohio. Simpson was elected a Bishop of the Mehodist Episcopal Church in 1852, and this huge volume presents the chief facts of Methodist History up to its copyright year of 1876. This book offers an alphabetical arrangement of events marking the growth of Methodism in England and America.

Whether you are doing in-depth research or just casual scanning, you can discover the main doctrines of "Methodism" and our agreement with or divergence from other denominations. Here are sketches of our seminaries, colleges, and universities. One can trace the branches of Methodism, such as the Methodist Episcopal (M.E.) Church, the M.E. South, and the African M.E. Church. There are articles on Bible words such as "altar," "amen," and "singing;" and on such biblical teachings as "assurance," "attributes of God," "baptism" and "sanctification." Here we can learn about the Wesley family and especially John and Charles Wesley and the Evangelical Revival of the 18th century. In addition, this book is chock-full of illustrations and photographs, not only of people but also places and church buildings.

This marvellous resource comes to us from the recently-discontinued Salem United Methodist Church. It was my privilege to be Salem's Pastor a few years ago, and I love their congregation of faithful members. Two ladies of the former Salem Church, Barbara Cline and Bonnie Simmons, brought *The Cyclopedia of Methodism* to me. After I familiarized myself with this great work, the three of us agreed to offer it as a gift to the Cornerstone Community Church Library. This one-of-a-kind resource is now under the care of Janet Boone, and—along with all the other attractions in our library—is available to you.





Welcome Back


