The Lord's Supper

Scripture: 1st Corinthians 11:23-28

What the Savior did: (Vv. 23-25)

- <u>He held up the BREAD</u> (Vs. 23) "(23) For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, (24) and when he had given thanks, he broke it..."
- **He held up the CUP (Vs. 25)** "(25) In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood…"

What the Savior said: (Vv. 24-25)

- <u>Concerning the BREAD</u> (Vs. 24): "(24) Take, eat: this is My body, which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of me."
 - The broken bread symbolizes Jesus' broken body given for sinners.
- <u>Concerning the CUP</u> (Vs. 25): "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."
 - The cup symbolizes the bitter wrath & suffering Jesus would endure (Matthew 26:38-39).

The PURPOSE of Holy Communion: The Lord's Supper

1) It serves as a BACKWARD look to the Cross (Vv. 25-26)

"(25) This do... in <u>remembrance</u> of me. (26) For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you **proclaim** the Lord's <u>death</u> till He comes."

Remembrance: The Passover Feast was a commemorative meal (Exodus 12:14), so also is the Lord's Supper a memorial supper - recalling Christ's death for sinners.

Proclaim: (Gk: kataggelló): "to proclaim." Usage: I declare openly, proclaim, preach, laud, celebrate.

2) It serves as an INWARD look to the Conscience (Vs. 28)

"(28) But let a man **examine** himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup."

Examine: (Gk: dokimazo): "to test, try, approve, allow, discern."

<u>Psalm 139:23-24</u> - "(23) Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. (24) See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."

3) It serves as a FORWARD look to the Crown (Vs. 26) "(26) ...till He comes."

Comes: (Gk: erchomai): "to come, go." Usage: I come, go. (back and forth)

- 1st Corinthians 1:8 "(8) On the day of our Lord Jesus Christ."
- The "day" when Jesus Returns at the end of the age (Matthew 24:27-36).

<u>Matthew 26:29</u> "...I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on <u>until</u> that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom."
