STEWARDSHIP DEFINITION: STEWARDSHIP IS THE PROPER MANAGEMENT OF MY LIFE & GIVING IN ORDER TO ENHANCE AND GROW THE KINGDOM OF GOD!

Principles of tithing... John Maxwell

<u>God's the Owner – I'm the manager</u> (Psalm 24:1) - "(1) The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it;"

<u>Practicing Stewardship produces growth</u> (Matthew 6:20) - "(20) But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy,"

<u>Stewardship deals with our present resources</u> - "The person who waits to do a great deal of good at once – will never do anything" (Samuel Johnson).

<u>God deserves the first of everything</u> - 1st Corinthians 16:2 - "(2) On the first day of the week let each one of you lay something aside, storing up as he may prosper."

<u>Proverbs 3:9</u> – "(9) Honor the Lord with your possessions, and with the first fruits of all your increase."

<u>Stewardship begins with loving, not giving 2nd Corinthians 9:7</u> - "(7) not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver."

Stewardship believes until God is in control of my life, I am out of control

<u>You cannot out give God</u> (Malachi 3:10-12) - "(10) ... 'Test me in this' says the Lord Almighty, 'and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing..."

<u>Context</u>: During Paul's Third missionary journey, he collected offerings for the impoverished Christians in Jerusalem from the Macedonian churches: *Philippi, Thessalonica & Berea*. Paul reminds the Corinthian Church to follow through with their promise to give to hurting Christians in Jerusalem.

Godly Giving: Paul's two examples of sacrifice (2nd Corinthians 8:1-9)

First Example - The Macedonian Christians: (Vv. 1-5)

- ➤ They sacrificially shared their money with the Jerusalem Church: (Vv. 1-4)
- They surrendered their will to Jesus: "(5) And they did not do as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then to us in keeping with God's will."

<u>Second Example – Jesus Christ</u>: **(Vs. 9)** "(9) For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that through his poverty might become rich."

Why Jesus did this? His grace-filled sacrifice made spiritually poor people rich.

Stewardship Lessons of Giving Joyfully to our Lord (2nd Corinthians 8:1-9; 9:5-7)

- 1) The Joy of Giving is going beyond our ability (2nd Corinthians 8:1-3)
- "(1) And now, brothers, we want you to know about the grace that God has given the **Macedonian** churches. (2) Out of the most severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. (3) For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own."
 - The Macedonian Church (*Philippi, Thessalonica & Berea*) gave because they had the joy of Jesus in their hearts.

SEVERE: (Gk: thlipsis): "Tribulation."

TRIAL: (Gk: dokimé): "trial, proving, approval."

BEYOND: (Gk: para): "from beside, by the side of, by."

2) When Christians Give beyond what is Required, we show our Consecration to God - "(5) And they did not do as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then to us in keeping with God's will."

"Show me a man or woman who is partial in his dedication to Christ, and I'll show you a man or woman who is partial in His giving to the Cause of Christ!" Rev. Dr. Ed Beck

3) Giving must be evidenced with Joy for Christ (2nd Corinthians 9:6-14)

"(6) Remember this; Whoever sows sparingly will also **reap** sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also **reap** generously. (7) Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves **a cheerful giver.**"

The Reminder of Godly Giving: (Vs. 6)

REAP: (Gk: speiró): "To sow." Meaning: spread, scatter.

The Reward of Godly Giving: (Vv. 7-14)

CHEERFUL: (Gk: hilaros): "cheerful, joyous."

*Usage: Cheerful, not grudging, already won over - already persuaded; cheerfully ready to act.
