A WORD OF ENCOURAGEMENT

OUR MARCHING ORDERS

For the six years before I took the "Retired" relationship in 1999, I was the appointed Superintendent of the Portsmouth District of The United Methodist Church. I very much enjoyed the congregation at Clarksburg, Ohio. Recently I came across a Facebook message posted by the current pastor at Clarksburg. The Rev. David Yinger wrote:

Don't stop preaching the gospel no matter how discouraged you get, or how unfruitful it may seem. People are watching and listening. They may not show it, but you are affecting them in more ways than you know.

This Pastor's "word of encouragement" reminded me of the "marching orders" Jesus left with His disciples! We call it the "Great Commission:"

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. (Matthew 28:19-20)

Today there are a number of significant challenges to public morality: Gender identity, marriage, parent-child relationships, freedom of speech, freedom of religion and conscience, anti-Semitism, and the sanctity of human life. The Bible speaks to these issues, but our culture seems increasingly to reject Biblical values. This being the case, how do we fulfill the Great Commission?

In their pagan world, the first disciples practiced and proclaimed their faith so as to "make disciples" and "teaching them" the Way of Christ. You and I can follow their example, (1) first by studying the Scriptures to know and live out the standards of Biblical morality; then (2) by praying for family, for our congregation and for governmental leaders at all levels; (3) by serving whenever and wherever possible; (4) by witnessing to our faith and convictions as God gives opportunity; and finally (5) by inviting persons in our circles of influence to come to Christ as Savior and Lord.

Can we make an impact for God's Kingdom in our own family? perhaps in our own neighborhood, and even beyond? By word and deed, let us serve "the gospel no matter how discouraged [we] get, or how unfruitful it may seem. People are watching and listening, They may not show it, but [we] are affecting them in more ways than [we] know!"

I want to obey my "marching orders!" And these "marching orders" call for my obedience in the current, up-to-date language of the mission-statement of our Cornerstone Community Church in Fredericktown::SHARING HOPE IN CHRIST, ALL OVER TOWN, ACROSS GENERATIONS, AROUND THE WORLD!

Some we will potentially be presenting will be information on good nutrition; Ohio Advanced Directives; ieducation on Alzheimer's and other dementia care; how to know nursing homes are giving quality of care and quality of life for their residents .. this will include the "Nursing Home Resident Rights" while living in a nursing home. This Resident Rights list is long and sweeping in scope, however we all need to know what they are to make sure every resident's rights are being adhered to and so we can be an advocate for the best as can be.

We know that the Sunday Small Groups have a system in which when their attendees need food assistance after surgery, illness, or other needs it is put in place. However anyone not in a Sunday Small Group may not get the help we might be able to give. So if you do not attend a small group, we are willing to get you some assistance if you call the office and the information will then be given to this ministry to follow up on. 
