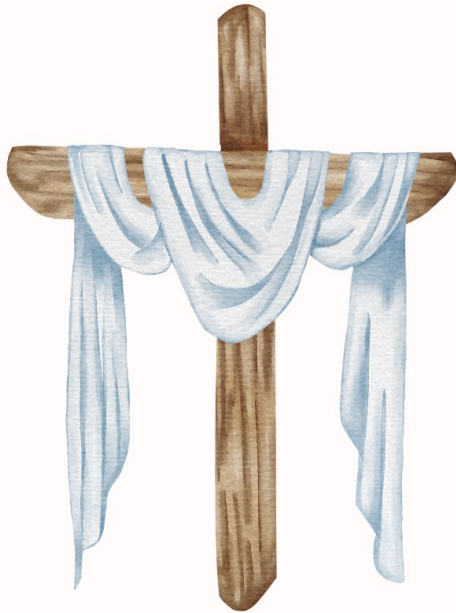

As we approach springtime, we are reminded God brings new life through His resurrection and power! The Easter season has arrived (April 20, 2025 - Easter Sunday), and we are ready to leave this cold, bitter winter behind us! Christians are “Easter people” believing the resurrection of Jesus Christ is the most significant event in world history as our Lord proved His power over sin, death, and the grave. In fact, we worship on Sunday’s year-round because of the Easter event. Easter reminds us as Christians Jesus is Lord of the Sabbath – and He resurrected on Sunday, not Saturday.

Jesus rewrote the day we worship. The Bible tells us in 1st Corinthians 16:2 and Revelation 1:10 - **“The Lord’s Day”** meant *Sunday*. On Sunday early Christians celebrated with worship, communion and giving of their tithes to God - because Jesus Christ rose from the dead on Sunday morning. Today, it is a weekly reminder Jesus changed even the Sabbath day of worship – and fulfilled the Old Covenant Law through His blood shed on the cross for our salvation (Hebrews 10:1-18).

John 20:19-20 says, *“(19) On the evening of that **first day of the week**, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, ‘**Peace be with you!**’ (20) After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.”*

In this section of Scripture, through verse 27, Jesus tells those who were terrified, **“Peace be with you!”** This is with an exclamation point identifying the writer, John, and what he accounted for as an eyewitness. Christ leaves us with His peace and power. Let us as His Church calm the darkness around us with those assuring words, **“Peace be with you!”**

There is something special about Sunday:

- ◇ Sunday is the day Jesus rose from the dead (Luke 24:1-12).
- ◇ Sunday is the day Jesus appeared to his closest disciples and friends (John 20:19-20).
- ◇ Sunday is the day we are reminded of Jesus' power over physical and spiritual death, and He is alive and walking with us (Luke 24:13-35).
- ◇ Sunday is our weekly reminder to rest on the Sabbath and set it apart to make it holy before our God without work (Exodus 20:8-10 – fourth commandment).
- ◇ Sunday is a reminder of God's peace – through worship, rest, and renewal before going into another tough week.

If we are to be fruitful Christians, we need Easter. We need Easter **every week** to be reminded Jesus is alive, our hope is in Him and our faith is fragile if we neglect to stay connected to “the Vine” (John 15:1-8).

Why do I write this thought back and forth about Easter, Sunday, rest, strength, and peace? They are all *interconnected*. If we desire God's all-surpassing peace, we must be connected to Jesus, worship Him, have encouragement by fellow Christians, and be held to account in our Christian lives by the preaching and teaching of God's Word!

The early Christians depended on Sunday. Why? They knew they may not be around next week on Sunday, because their faith literally cost them all - to follow Jesus as Lord.

Do we depend on Sunday? Do we depend on Jesus? Do we depend on Easter? Do you need God's peace and strength? Then be reminded of our witness as Christians and the early Christians as being marked when setting aside Sunday as **“The Lord's Day!”**

THE BEAUTY OF JESUS

Generations of Christians have sung the chorus,

Let the beauty of Jesus be seen in me...All His
wonderful passion and purity!

O Thou Spirit Divine, all my nature refine, Till the
beauty of Jesus is seen in me.

For the majority, this simple song also expresses their deepest desire, This is truly the earnest prayer of the believing heart. When we come to know Jesus as our Savior, we want our lives to point others to Him. We want to obey Jesus as the Lord of our life; we hope to imitate His example of compassion and love; we study and pray that we may grow into His likeness.

The Bible teaches and the Church proclaims the Good News that it is through faith in Jesus Christ that a person is freed from the guilt of her/his sins and also that he/she is born again and becomes a new creature in Jesus Christ. God's plan of salvation provides both our justification and forgiveness and also our newness of life and sanctification. We know Jesus Christ as “the source of our life,” and He “became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption” (1 Corinthians 1:30).

As members of the Body of Christ (the Church), we do pray that “the beauty of Jesus” may be seen in us. So that we may be Christ-like, we faithfully read our Bible, we pray, we attend worship, and we observe other spiritual disciplines. While this is all well-and-good, it may leave the impression that one's growth in holiness is an achievement, produced by good works and hard efforts!

But let us never forget that salvation is always by grace, through faith, on account of Christ. Every aspect of salvation is the gift of God, received as we place our trust in Jesus Christ as Savior and as we follow Him as our Lord. By His atoning death, our wonderful Savior delivers us from the guilt of our sins, and He also frees us from sin's dominion. Indwelling us in the person of the Holy Spirit, Jesus Christ justifies and also sanctifies us!

The Old Testament book of Leviticus calls the people of God to “be holy, for I the LORD your God am holy” (Leviticus 19:2). Did the devout Hebrew, or a priest under the Old Covenant, somehow achieve holiness by observing the many laws recorded in Leviticus? Could one sanctify oneself by one's law-abiding conduct?

Not so! The “word of encouragement” comes from the Lord when He promises, “I will sanctify you” as at Leviticus 21:8, 15, 23; 22:9, 16.. Now be encouraged also by Peter's quotation of Leviticus 19:2 in the context of 1 Peter 1:13-25...and pray when you sing, “Let the beauty of Jesus be seen in me!”

What is the Seder Meal?

This special Maundy Thursday Service helps us to understand the symbolism the Lord used to the Israelites at the Passover meal before they fled Egypt. This first Passover represented the future Messiah, Jesus, the Lamb of God who would take away the sins of the world.

As we participate in partaking of the symbols, we will better understand what communion really means.

Seder Meal-A Passover Celebration

For each place setting:

1. 4 small communion cups and large bowl
2. Boiled or roasted egg
3. Parsley or cilantro
4. 2 bitter herb (romaine lettuce is fine)
5. Horseradish
6. Charoset (apple mixture)
7. Small container of salt water
8. Matzah
9. Napkin and silverware
10. Copy of Haggadah service

For each table:

1. Pitcher of water
2. Candle
3. Flowers or spring centerpiece



MAUNDY THURSDAY PRAYER VIGIL

APRIL 17, 2025

Just hours before Jesus Christ went to the Cross for our salvation, He met with His disciples in an Upper Room. It was there that He spoke the words that transformed the Passover Feast into The Lord's Supper, and our Lord instituted the New Covenant in His blood, "poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins." This wonderful and solemn story is recorded in Matthew 26, in Mark 16 and in Luke 22.

From the Upper Room, Jesus leads the Eleven to the Garden of Gethsemane, where He prays and then is betrayed by Judas Iscariot. Following His arrest and trial, the symbolism of the Last Supper becomes the reality of saving grace! Christ Himself is the Passover Lamb!

Down through the centuries until the present time, the Church has lived out this story, because it is the very heart of the Gospel. Here at Cornerstone Community Church in Fredericktown, we will recall these saving events on the Thursday of Holy Week. The Maundy Thursday Prayer Vigil will begin at 6:00 AM and continue, hour by hour until 11:00 PM. This 16-hour day will include an observance of the "Seder Meal," and Holy Communion from 7:00 to 8:00 PM. During the remaining 15 hours, prayer partners will keep the vigil of prayer.

PRAYER PARTNERS

Prayer partners are asked to be in the Prayer Room at the Church for one hour. Each participant will receive a prayer-packet, complete with devotional thoughts and guidance for praying, as well as specific prayer requests.

We want to have at least one prayer partner in the Prayer Room for each hour between 6:00 in the morning and 11:00 o'clock that night, except for the time of worship from 7:00 to 8:00 PM. The Prayer Room can, of course, accommodate more than one person, so a couple might come together, for example, or spiritual friends might join each other. Those who who cannot come to the Church for any reason, are also welcome to partner with us in prayer, and they will receive the same prayer-packet.

Joy Campbell is coordinating the Prayer Vigil, and she will use the telephone to recruit prayer partners. However, if you do not receive a call from her, you may volunteer by telephoning Joy at 740-501-1731. Volunteer partners are welcome, and very much appreciated!

Class: World Religions from a Christian Perspective 8 Weeks

In this study, we will learn to see the differences between our faith in the One True God, and the main beliefs of these other religions. We'll compare and contrast and better know why we believe and what we believe, and in Whom we believe.

Class: A video study authored by Ray Vander Laan: RVL Discipleship 8 Weeks

Teacher: Larry Overholt

The series teaches a Biblical context of what it means to be a disciple. Discipleship was formalized with the rise of rabbis in Jewish culture, but the concept really started much earlier than that. This idea of knowing God's path and faithfully walking in it began when He called Israel out of Egypt, setting them apart as a kingdom of priests to show the rest of the world what He was like. The series explores the roots of discipleship, examining how God trained and established the nation of Israel in preparation for Jesus' ministry to come. We will have a participant's guide of 138 pages. Each week will follow this outline:

1. Introduction (7-10 minutes).
2. Play the teaching video and take notes (12-15 minutes).
3. As a group, work through discussion questions as you process the video episode (20+ minutes).
4. Wrap It Up and end each meeting with Prayer (7-10 minutes).

So, after much prayer and lively conversation, the PeaceMeals Board of Directors, Staff Pastor Parish Relations Committee members, and some staff members who have served with PeaceMeals since it began 14 years ago made the decision to serve meals again only in the great room. Those who are handicapped and cannot walk into the great room will be able to park in the handicapped spots and one volunteer will get their carry-out meals.

We have been passing out notices of this change for three weeks and it has been a welcome sight to already notice some of our neighbors eating inside.

Please pray with us for the many who will accept this invitation, for each person to feel God's love and find a new hunger for the Bread of Life.

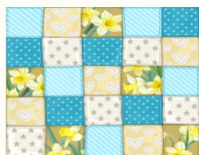

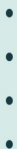

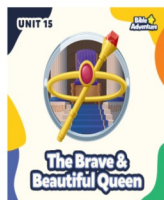


KID ZONE

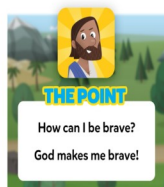

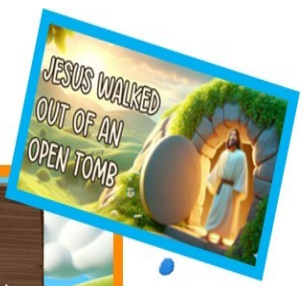

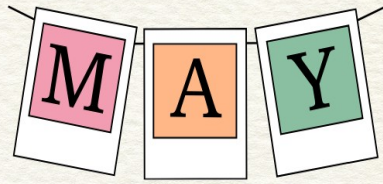
