Revelation: A Heavenly Message (Series part 1)

Scripture: Revelation 1:1-11

The Book of Revelation is a disclosure of Christ's agenda to inform believers of future events. The author, John, was banished to Patmos, a rocky isle in the Aegean Sea (1:9) where the Romans had a prison colony. Revelation was written in the last third of the first century — between Nero (A.D. 54-68) and the end of Domitian's rule (A.D. 81-96).

The Second Coming is mentioned 318 times in 216 chapters of the New Testament (27 books), and over 50 times in the epistles. One out of twenty-five verses in New Testament refers to the *Second Coming*.

"End Time" Biblical Greek Terms:

<u>Parousia</u> – "Coming, being near, advent, presence, return of Christ to punish Jerusalem and the wicked." (1st Corinthians 15:23-24; Matt. 24:3, 27, 37; 1st Thess. 2:19, 3:13, 4:15, 5:23, 2nd Peter 1:16; 3:4, 12; 1st John 2:28)

<u>Epiphaneia</u> – "Appearance" – "manifestation referring to Christ's coming forth out of a hidden background" (2nd Thess. 2:8; 1st Tim. 6:14; 2nd Tim. 4:1, 8; Titus 2:13)

<u>Apocalupsis</u> – "Unveiling" - pointing to the "removal of that which now obstructs our vision of Christ" (1st Corinthians 1:7; 2nd Thess. 1:7; 1st Peter 1:7, 13).

REVELATION: (Gk: Apokalypsis): "Unveiling; disclosure of what had previously been concealed."

Revelation Reveals Jesus' Exaltation:

- "Blazing Glory" (Rev. 1:7-20)
- "Lord over His Church" (Chapters 2-3)
- Jesus returns to take back the earth from Satan (Chapters 4-20).
- Jesus illuminating heaven (Chapters 21-22).

Revelation's Outline: (Revelation 1:19) "(19) Write the things which you have seen, and the things which are, and the things which will take place after this."

- Chapter 1: "...the things which you have seen"
- Chapters 2-3: "The things which are"
- Chapters 4-22 "the things which will take place after this."

John Receives a Heavenly Message (Revelation 1:1-11)

1) The SOURCE of this message (Vv. 1-2)

The title: "(1) The Revelation of Jesus Christ."

- "(1) ... Which God gave Him to show His servants"
 - God (Father) gave Jesus the details to show His Church (servants).
- "(1) ... Things which <u>must</u> shortly take place"
 - Revealing an event occurring *suddenly*; not necessarily soon (Matthew 24:36).
- "(2) who bore witness to the word of God, and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, to all things that he saw."
- **2)** The PROMISE of this message (Vs. 3) "(3) Blessed is the one who reads the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it, because the time is near."

- Revelation is the only book in the Bible promising "blessing" to those who read it (Rev. 22:6-7);
 and damnation to those who change it (Rev. 22:18-19).
- 3) The RECIPIENTS of this message (Vs. 4) "(4) John, to the seven churches which are in Asia:"
 - Revelation was initially written to the seven churches in Asia Minor (Turkey).
 - > This was a 50-mile circuit, starting in Ephesus.

Seven: "Completeness, totality, rest, divine perfection."

4) The GREETINGS of this message (Vv. 4-5)

<u>God the Father</u> - "(4) ...from **Him** who is, and who was, and who is to come," <u>The sevenfold Spirit</u> - "(4) and from the **seven spirits** before his throne."

- Seven Spirits: (7) = Total completeness, divine perfection.
- The Holy Spirit in *completeness* the *totality* of the Holy Spirit before the throne of God. *Isaiah 11:2-3

 The Son "(5) and from Jesus Christ,"
- **5)** The THEME of this message Jesus (Vv. 5-8) "(5) and from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth... '(8) I am the Alpha and Omega,' says the Lord God, 'who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty.'"

Who Jesus is:

- God's "faithful witness" Faithful unto death (John 8:14).
- "The firstborn from the dead" The resurrected Christ (Luke 24:1-8).
- "ruler of the kings of the earth" Christ's Kingdom established on earth.
- "Alpha and Omega" The first and last letters of the Greek alphabet (A, O).

Symbolism: Jesus spans all-time and space - beginning & ending of history!

• "The Almighty" - Eternal One

What Jesus has done: (Vv. 5-6) - "(5b) ... To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood, (6) and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father – to him be the glory and power for ever and ever! Amen."

What Jesus will do: (Vs. 7) – "(7) Look, he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and all the peoples of the earth will mourn because of him. So shall it be! Amen."

- He will come in the clouds and reveal Himself (Daniel 7:13; Zechariah 12:10; Acts 1:9-11).
- **6)** The Place, Time and Sound of this message (Vv. 9-10) "(9) I, John, your brother and companion in the suffering and kingdom and patient endurance that are ours in Jesus, was on **the island of Patmos** because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. (10) **On the Lord's Day** I was in the Spirit, and I heard behind me **a loud voice like a trumpet**,"
 - Isle of Patmos (Vs. 9)
 - On the Lord's Day (Sunday) (Vs. 10)
 - "(10) a loud voice like a trumpet"

Isaiah 27:13 - "(13) And in that day a great trumpet will sound..."

> Jewish tradition maintains that the shophar will be sounded to usher in the final messianic redemption (Revelation 8-9).
