Dear Cornerstone Community Church family,

What is TRUTH? This question has endured throughout human history. Satan attacked Truth when He left God's side as a created angel, to depart from his Makers' Lordship to rebel against God and set up his own form of truth called sin (Gen. 3:1-7).

Truth is defined by Websters dictionary as: "the body of real things, events, and facts: actuality; the state of being the case: fact; a transcendent fundamental or spiritual reality; a judgment, proposition, or idea that is true or accepted as true; the body of true statements and propositions; fidelity to an original or to a standard."

If I say, "Two plus two equals nine," we know my statement (by mathematical Law) is false. If I say, "Oxygen is not needed for human beings to live and survive," my statement goes against Scientific Law. If I say, "Evil is good and God approves sin," my statement goes against God's Law (His Word). Truth cannot be altered, because if it is – it defiles the very entity it is upholding – itself.

When a society, Church, person, or other thing changes even the slightest part of Truth, the remainder of it is out of order, impure and unstable. This is why God's Law (His Truth) cannot change. Let me explain. If God changes His mind or His Truth, it will mean God is variable and shifting. This would conclude what God said to begin with was not Truth - in the first place - because He changed His mind. Anything else after this point He proclaims cannot be trusted. Why? Because it, too, may change and not be ongoing Truth.

Having said all the above, Truth cannot change, nor can it go away. Truth always stands by itself! You can kill the messenger, the prophet, the preacher, or the vocal piece – but Truth will never be silenced because it is permanent. Truth has always been and will always be. This is Eternal Truth.

This is a concept in theology and the Church of Jesus Christ, that our world must come and grapple with. A more modern-day definition would be the term, “Absolute Truth.”

In our current culture, issues like gender, life, morals, evil, God, satan, lifestyles, vices, gambling, abortion, alcohol, drugs, cheating, lying, infidelity, honesty, purity, and other questions are all in the mix – trying to see which side they land on between Truth and falsehood.

The Bible, God’s Word and Law, is either true or false! Jesus is either God’s Son who went to the cross for our sins, rose from the dead, and His life saved our life by His blood, or He is false.

What do we “store up” in our everyday life? What do we “treasure” and value most? Is there only One Master in our life, or do we have two, three, four, five...or more masters mastering us?

Kingdom Truth is coming to God’s only Son, Jesus, coming under His Truth and living for Jesus’ Kingdom as stated in the Bible by Jesus Christ. I place my life in God’s Truth. Charlie Kirk proclaimed this in his debates, and God is sending this same truth out through the airways and technology today. What will you do with Jesus’ Truth? Every messenger will perish, but Jesus’ Truth is everlasting!

I love you with all my soul and being. My calling as a Pastor is to make sure you know the Truth, and you reach heaven’s gate with the assurance of Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior (1st John 5:11-13).

A WORD OF ENCOURAGEMENT

BREAK-THROUGH!

The fifth book in the New Testament is The Acts of the Apostles. Its twenty-eight chapters tell us about...

The birthday of the Church “when the day of Pentecost had come” and “all of them were filled with the Holy Spirit” (2:1 and 4);

The growth of the Church when believers “received the gift of the Holy Spirit” and “the Lord added to their number those who were being saved” (2:38 and 47);

The mission of the Church when “the Holy Spirit said, ‘set apart for me [those] for the work to which I have called them’” and they were “sent out by the Holy Spirit” (13:2 and 4).

This overview, and the many wonderful details I have not recounted, justify the suggestion that the book’s title might well be The Acts of the Holy Spirit! In the great story of salvation which is the major theme of the whole Bible, whenever and wherever the Holy Spirit comes upon God’s people, there is a BREAK-THROUGH to the acts of God among us, a departure from the ordinary that reveals the will of God and puts on display God’s Presence and God’s purposes.

We see such a BREAK-THROUGH in the first paragraph of Acts chapter three (3:1-10): It was three o'clock in the afternoon...nothing unusual about that! Peter and John were going up to the temple because it was the hour of prayer...nothing bad about that, but also nothing unusual. Just another "same-ole, same-ole," just an expected, regular day!

As the two Apostles were going through the Beautiful Gate of the temple, they saw a man who had been lame from birth. Every day, the lame man's friends carried him up to the Beautiful Gate, so he could beg alms of those going in to pray. That's his life, day-after-day... nothing unusual, perfectly acceptable in that society, "same-ole, same-ole." Nothing changed, nothing expected to change!

BUT...the BREAK-THROUGH begins when Peter and John "look intently" at the lame man and tell him to "look at us!" Peter speaks BREAK-THROUGH words when he says, "Silver and gold have I none but such as I have, I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ, rise and walk!" And now it's a genuine BREAK-THROUGH when the beggar enters the temple "walking and leaping and praising God!"

When we pray for physical healing, for the healing of bad memories, for the healing of broken relationships, for the peace and well-being of ourselves and others, shouldn't we expect our "same-ole, same-ole" to be transformed into divine BREAK-THROUGH? Please join me in the faith that our ordinary, expected and even acceptable days will become the Holy Spirit's BREAK-THROUGH times!

Living Under God's Dominion

This past summer, while visiting my home church in Rhode Island—the place where I first came to know Christ and where Dave and I were married—I heard a message from Pastor Keith Mlyniec that has stayed with me. It reminded me of a simple but profound truth: **God has dominion over all—forever.**

From the very beginning, Scripture declares this. In Genesis 1, we read that God created the heavens, the earth, and all that is in them. He formed mankind in His image, giving us responsibility to steward creation. Yet before we can understand our role, we must first grasp this: **God's dominion never diminishes.** He rules over all, always.

The Bible repeatedly affirms this eternal truth:

- *“His kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and His dominion endures from generation to generation”* (Daniel 4:34).
- *“To Him be glory and dominion forever and ever”* (1 Peter 4:11).
- *“The Lord has established His throne in the heavens, and His kingdom rules over all”* (Psalm 103:19).

What does this mean for us? Simply put, if God reigns over all, then our place is clear: **we are His subjects, His servants.** Our response is not to resist or pretend to live in a little “bubble kingdom” of our own making, but to humble ourselves under His authority.

That leads to two searching questions for each of us:

- **Am I obeying God's Word?** Not just hearing it, but living it—even when it stretches me or costs me.
- **Am I serving God's kingdom?** Not just attending church, but actively giving of my time, gifts, and heart so that He is glorified.

Obedience and service are not burdens; they are blessings. Like a loving Father, God knows what is best for His children. When we obey, we flourish. When we serve, He is glorified.

King David expressed it beautifully in his prayer in 1 Chronicles 29:

King David expressed it beautifully in his prayer in 1 Chronicles 29: *"Yours, O Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty... Yours is the kingdom, O Lord, and You are exalted as head above all."*

May we live each day with that same heart—serving, obeying, and joyfully acknowledging that **we belong to the King whose dominion never ends.**

So here's the invitation: step into God's dominion not only as His child, but also as His servant. Ask yourself, *"Where can I serve?"* It might be greeting at the door, teaching children, touching up paint, helping in the kitchen, visiting someone in need, or simply praying faithfully for the many ministries of our church. Whether big or small, every act of service honors our King. Together, let's live as a church family that reflects His kingdom by serving and obeying with joy.

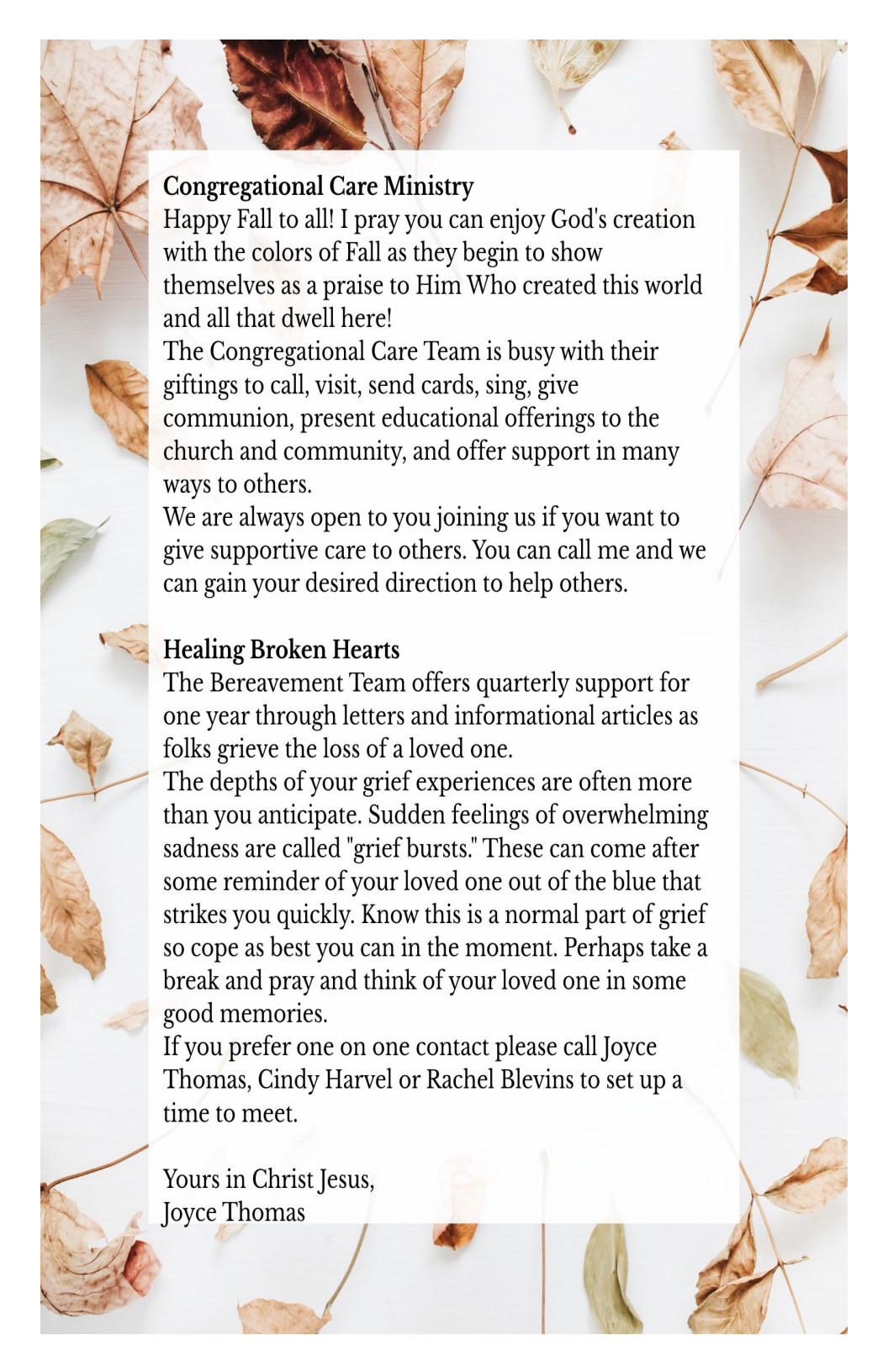

A CALL FOR STORM RELIEF CLEAN-UP KITS

FLOOD BUCKET - CLEANING KIT

Value: Roughly \$105.00 per Cleaning Kit (shopping at Dollar stores might reduce this cost)

Materials:

- One five-gallon round bucket with lid (14.35" h x 12.19" w x 12.19" d)
 - No screw lids
 - May be used, but must be free from all residual product
 - Advertisement on the outside acceptable
- One 32-64 oz. bottle liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner
 - No spray cleaners
- One 16-34 oz. bottle liquid dish soap
- One 4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener
- One 6-14 oz. pump spray insect repellent (pack of 10-20 wipes also acceptable)
 - Pump spray bottles must have protective covers
- One scrub brush
 - With or without handle
- 13 re-usable cleaning wipes
 - No terrycloth, microfiber, or paper towels
 - Remove from packaging
- Five scouring pads
 - No stainless steel or pads with soap in them
 - Remove from packaging
- 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic line)
- 24 roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33-45-gallon sizes)
 - Remove from packaging
- Five N95 particulate respirator dust masks (~3 mm thickness)
 - No surgical masks
- Two pairs kitchen gloves
 - Durable for multiple uses
 - Remove from packaging
- One pair work gloves
 - Cotton with leather palm or all leather



Assembly Directions

- Place all liquid items on the bottom of the bucket.
- Place remaining items in the bucket, fitting them around and between the liquid items.
- Scouring pads and trash bags can be separated in order to fit all items in the bucket.
- Clothespins may also be placed in a small re-sealable bag.
- Secure the lid on the filled bucket.

Important Notes

- All items must be new with the exception of the bucket and lid.
- All cleaning agents must be in liquid form. No powders are accepted.
- If items have been omitted, label the bucket. Please indicate which items are missing.
- Sponges have been removed from the list of supplies due to the challenge of locating the non-cellulose sponges that prevent mildew. Non-cellulose sponges will be added to each bucket upon arrival at the affiliate warehouse. .

BUDDY BREAK

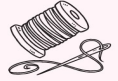

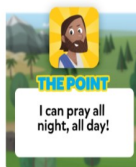


KID ZONE

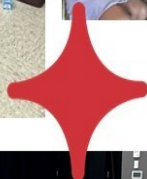

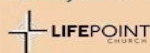
