

A WORD OF ENCOURAGEMENT

THE BIBLE'S MIDDLE VERSE

In my “Word of Encouragement” last spring, I shared insights the Lord gave me while I was doing daily devotions in the Bible’s longest chapter, Psalm 119. Now let me offer you the following information about the Bible as a whole—:

The longest chapter, again, is Psalm 119, with 176 verses in the English Bible. The shortest chapter, interestingly enough, is Psalm 117, with only 2 verses in the English Bible. And the middle chapter of our English Bible is...you guessed it!...Psalm 118.

There is a total of 1189 chapters in the whole Bible. 594 of them come before Psalm 118, and 594 chapters follow Psalm 118. This chapter, Psalm 118, stands exactly in the middle of 1188 other chapters, 594 chapters on either side of Psalm 118!

You may or may not be as excited as I am about these Bible statistics, but I think you will be helped, as I am, to be directed to the middle verse of your Bible. The one verse in our English Bible that stands right in the middle is Psalm 118:8. In the New Revised Standard Version Bible I have before me, this verse reads:

It is better to take refuge in the LORD
than to put confidence in mortals.

You and I are surrounded and sometimes feel overwhelmed by the modern world with its business and advertising, its politics and civic leaders, its sports and entertainments, its TV news and stories, and even by the Christian Church with its inspired leaders...devoted laity with wonderful skills, and clergy who are truly called and commissioned as God’s messengers. Some of these certainly influence us, and there are many who earn our trust. Unfortunately, however, even the best may disappoint us. Even good people sometimes yield to temptation, and use their place and position for personal pleasure or self-centered gain.

Ultimately, for the sake of my salvation and my eternal destiny, I am secure only by looking to my Lord rather than any human leader. I am saved by grace—God’s grace! I am kept by love—God’s love! I am guided by truth—God’s truth! It will always be better for me to look to the triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, than to put confidence in mere mortals. God alone is my refuge! Indeed, God is your refuge!

Bereavement Ministry

Grieving is hard work! Anyone who has lost a loved one knows how much grieving can change your life. The loss of a loved one causes many physical problems as the body goes into the “Fight or Flight” mode, and it often takes a long time for that to wind down.

Exhaustion, issues with digestion, mental health, and memory are only a few of the feelings and effects we feel after a loss. It is suggested that you give yourself grace to not be on top of your game while grieving. Nor should you expect to be able to focus or handle “normal” tasks as you have in the past for the time being.

Letters and articles for help in processing and coping are sent periodically for a year to those in this congregation that have had a loss. If you wish to talk one-on-one please contact Joyce Thomas, Rachel Blevins or Cindy Harvel for support, so your grief can be supported and you cared for.

Buddy Break








