(8) And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death – even death on a cross.*"

My prayer for our beloved Church is we will be found faithful and brought to an emptiness of self. Why? To glorify God while building our lives upon the Rock – the security of our faith – Jesus Christ.

May we Reach, ReTrain, ReTain, ReRelease and ReProduce for Jesus' Kingdom. My prayer is for Jesus Christ's blessings and strength be imparted and overflowing upon God's ministry here at Cornerstone Community Church in 2026!


Dear church family,

Fredericktown Interchurch Year End Report

Thank you for your donations to Fredericktown Interchurch this past year, your continued support allows Interchurch to provide food assistance, financial aid, clothing and gas vouchers for our clients.

Here are the estimated stats for 2025:

Financial aid – 84 households (17 more than 2024) = \$29,784.16 (almost \$12,000 more than 2024).

Food Pantry – 374 households (up by 48) = 1096 individuals (up by 112) = 9,864 meals (up by 1,008)

Gas vouchers – 10 (2 in 2024)

Clothing Vouchers – 33 (30 in 2024)

Summer Lunch program = 50 children enrolled (26 last year). Each child received 3 breakfasts and 3 lunches/week for approximately 6 weeks). Same children received Back to School Supplies based on the Fredericktown 2025-2026 school list.

Turn the Tide - 50 households were given a Christmas food basket with ham, macaroni and cheese, green beans and corn, peaches and applesauce, apples, candy, cookies and a “goodie bag” for each child (93 children).

Last summer we joined with Dumbaugh’s Farm Market and provided vouchers for our clients to use at the market for fresh produce. Hopefully we will be able to do that again this summer.

Fredericktown is so caring and giving; Interchurch is blessed to be a part of this community.







Dear Friend,

Starting Point has exciting news to announce: We are going mobile in 2026! We have partnered with ICU Mobile to launch a mobile unit as an extension of our center.

ICU Mobile is a Christian organization specializing in pregnancy center mobile ministry. They have operated mobile units for over 20 years and have a wealth of knowledge and experience to share with us as we begin our mobile journey. ICU Mobile shares Starting Point's passion for protecting life in the womb and for sharing the hope of Christ with women and families, as demonstrated in their slogan, "Striving to save the not yet born—and the not yet born again." Our affiliation with ICU Mobile will continue to be a source of great encouragement and godly wisdom as we take our services on the road!

On Starting Point's mobile unit, we will offer pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, STI testing and treatment and abortion pill reversal, all of which will be completely free and confidential. In addition to providing these vital services, we plan to use our mobile unit as an educational tool to help us share with our community the truth about life. As stated in our mission statement, Starting Point exists to "create a Christian community where abortion is unthinkable." To accomplish this, we hope to utilize our mobile for engaging educational experiences with the youth of Knox County, teaching them about fetal development so that if they are ever faced with an unexpected pregnancy in the future, they understand the value of life and would never consider pursuing an abortion.

January is Sanctity of Human Life Month, which is a reminder to each of us that every heartbeat reflects God's image, and every soul is one He longs to redeem. In Matthew 28:18-20, Jesus tells His disciples,

“...All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”

Here in the Great Commission, Christ calls His disciples to action, and with our mobile unit we are responding to Him with active obedience. We are going to women in our community instead of sitting back and waiting for them to come to us. We are taking our services, but more importantly, we are taking God's truth and love to women and families who desperately need the hope of Christ. By stepping out in faith, we are proclaiming both the value of life and the hope of salvation, trusting that God will use this mobile ministry to expand His kingdom and transform lives.
