Summer is a time when we have longer days and more time on our hands to enjoy the outdoors - compared to winter months. This time of year, we are more active, travel more, and can experience the beauty of God's Creation in its fullness. But we can also waste time and not use it wisely. We can spiritually bypass important disciplines and times of Worship by the "distractions of goodness" in our world.

Preparing for the move of God requires Christian **perception**, **preparation**, and a **position of humility**. The Bible story below is about a Shunammite woman who cooked, cared, and comforted the man of God, Elisha. The Shunammite woman desired God's presence in her life.

2nd Kings 4:8-10 - *"(8) One day **Elisha** went to Shunem. And a well-to-do woman was there, who urged him to stay for a meal. So whenever he came by, he stopped there to eat. (9) She said to her husband, 'I know that this man who often comes our way is a holy man of God.' (10) Please, **let us make** a small upper room on the wall; and **let us put** a bed for him there, and a table and a chair and a lampstand; so it will be, whenever he comes to us, he can turn in there."*

The Shunammite woman was barren and could not have children. She had lived for one hundred years prior to this story.

She built onto her home (with her husband's help) an *upper room*. She placed in her home an arrangement of furniture to house the man of God, Elisha. She enjoyed when Elisha stopped by in his travels around Israel – to have a meal with them. She knew the “move of God” was in the “man of God” (Old Testament prophet – Elisha). She wanted this blessing for her life – and God did something she could have never imagined (God gave her a baby boy at the age of 100 [Vv. 13-17]).

Have you **perceived** where God's power comes from to be in tune to His plan and Will (Romans 12:1-2; Psalm 119:9-11, 16; Acts 1:8)? Is your **preparation** setting up God's plan, to “come to pass” in your home, family, and challenges you face?

Have you spiritually **positioned** yourself to be near God's best - for his favor to happen in your life?

Pray: *Lord Jesus, may I trust in your plan for my life, my family, my lost loved ones, and impossible situations I have no control over. Help me to perceive what you want me to see, prepare me for what you want me to do, and humbly position my heart – under your guidance and Lordship, Amen!*

Have You Graduated?

Many members of Cornerstone Community Church had the privilege of congratulating our new high school grads on Saturday and Sunday afternoons (May 16-17). Joy and I did our first visit that Saturday. We posed with Kaira for a photo-shoot, told her how proud of her we are, and enjoyed a smorgasbord of goodies. But we were not the first guests to arrive, nor the last to leave. The next afternoon was a repeat performance around lunch time—this time extending our congratulations to Carter. And then, pretty much like an old-fashioned “progressive dinner,” we were with a crowd of fellow church members taking our gift and best wishes to Nolan and having a supper-time snack!

The graduates from our congregation were three out of 105 seniors who completed their studies at Fredericktown High School this spring. All of us wish our three the very best: Kaira Ruggles, Carter Hassel, and Nolan Bender. We pray for them as they progress to new opportunities and obligations. We join with their families and friends in our sincere congratulations.

Thinking about their time of passage and growth, I began to ponder the parallels in my career as a Christian. I believe my Lord sometimes congratulates me, and I know for sure He has to correct me quite often! There are quite a few biblical texts that challenge us to grow in the faith; other passages provide training geared toward Christian maturity. Some Scriptures call upon us to use our life experiences and problems to develop a closer walk with God.

One example is the opening of the New Testament book of James: The Spirit-inspired author links together the chain from trials to testing and adds endurance. And tells us that when “endurance has its perfect result, you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing” (James 1:2-4). The word translated “perfect” is the Greek term for “mature,” in the sense of achieving one’s purpose in life. And our word “complete” in the Greek New Testament conveys the idea of fulfilling all that God calls us to be and do!

So now I ask myself, Have I graduated? Or, at least, am I ready to progress in the faith? And if you don’t mind, I am asking you: Have you graduated yet? Or, at least, Are you ready to move on in your walk with Jesus? I’m hoping and praying that our Lord is eager to say to us, “Congratulations!”



Acts 20:35 In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

It is that amazing time of year when school has ended, families have plans of adventure to a new destination or return to the familiar cabin by the lake, even hatchlings have escaped their shells. Summer feels like freedom and excitement all on its own, but especially this summer when our blessed United States of America celebrates 250 years of liberty!

We aren't a perfect country, but we definitely have been used in the Hands of Almighty God as a refuge for the oppressed and a rescuer for other countries in danger of losing their own freedom. All that we have been and continue to be is only due to our individual commitments and joined alignment to God and His purposes.

On April 29, 1607, in Cape Henry, Virginia, 104 English colonists and 40 seamen, after surviving many hardships, fasted, worshipped, erected a cross on the beach, and made the following covenant with God led by Rev. Robert Hunt:

"We do hereby dedicate this Land, and ourselves, to reach the People within these shores with the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to raise up Godly generations after us, and with these generations take the Kingdom of God to all the earth. May this Covenant of Dedication remain to all generations, as long as this earth remains, and may this Land, along with England, be Evangelists to the World. May all who see this Cross remember what we have done here, and may those who come here to inhabit join us in this Covenant and in this most noble work that the Holy Scriptures may be fulfilled"

Each and every Christian church in the U.S.A. and the ministries within them continue to fulfill this covenant.

Cornerstone Community Church is exceptionally blessed to send out missionaries to several countries, to be a place of encouragement and peace, and to share God's provision with our community and beyond.

This summer, while the faithful kitchen staff enjoys a well-earned break, Peacemeals will continue to offer easy-to-prepare meals and coupons for free treats as our outreach ministry.

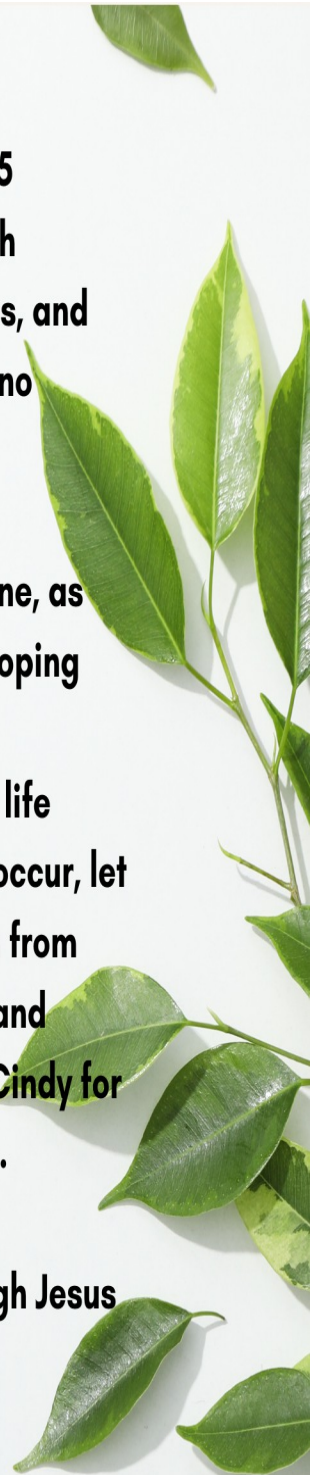


Healing Broken Hearts

Women's Walk is Oct. 15- 18, 2026. If you are interested in attending, please contact Kathy Toms or Jamie Sanders.

The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The program's approach seriously considers the model of Christ's servanthood and encourages Christ's disciples to act in ways appropriate to being "a servant of all." The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity, comprised of fifteen talks by lay and clergy on the themes of God's grace, Christian discipleship, and what it means to be the church. The course is wrapped in prayer and meditation, special times of worship, and daily celebration of Holy Communion. The "Emmaus community," made up of those who have attended an Emmaus weekend, support the 72-hour experience with a prayer vigil, by preparing and serving meals, and other acts of love and self-giving. The Walk to Emmaus typically begins Thursday evening and concludes Sunday evening. Men and women attend separate weekend events. During and after the three days, Emmaus leaders encourage participants to meet regularly in small groups. The members of the small groups challenge and support one another in faithful living. The three-day Emmaus experience and follow-up groups strengthen and renew Christian people as disciples of Jesus Christ and as active members of the body of Christ in mission to the world. The program, an offering of The Upper Room, invites and involves the participation of Christians of many Christian faith traditions. Emmaus is ecumenical not only because members of many faiths participate, but also because Emmaus seeks to foster Christian unity and to reinforce the whole Christian community. This is one of the great strengths and joys of the Emmaus movement. The fact that Emmaus is ecumenical does not mean it is theologically indifferent. On the contrary, the Walk to Emmaus is designed to communicate with confidence and depth the essentials of the Christian life, while accentuating those features that Christians have traditionally held in common.
